












- 1. Exercise more- 52% of participants said they wanted to hit the gym more this year.



THE RESILIENT CENTRAL COAST CAMPAIGN JUST Launched

The goal of the Resilient Central Coast Campaign is to achieve measurable progress towards reducing greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions from four areas (home energy use, transportation, food choices, and waste).

The Campaign utilizes an online organizing platform called BrightAction to engage micro-community leaders (e.g., neighborhood groups, church groups, Girl Scout troop leaders, civic clubs, university groups, etc.). Joining the Campaign provides such groups bilingual training, marketing materials, and other resources to encourage them to use their social networks to help achieve community building, GHG emissions reductions, and increased resiliency.







ENERGY UPGRADES FOR YOUR HOME NOW MORE AFFORDABLE WITH TAX CREDITS AND INCENTIVES

Want to make your home more energy efficient? Or maybe it's just time to replace an old appliance like a water heater, furnace or air conditioner? Whatever you motivation may be, the cost of such upgrades may now cost less thanks to new federal tax credits and 3C-REN's Home Energy Savings incentive program.

Starting January of 2023, residents may be eligible for new tax credits from the Inflation Reduction Act. The 30% tax credit is available for items like insulation, windows, heat pumps for heating and cooling, heat pump water heaters, rooftop solar and more. NEW ENERGY CODE IN EFFECT BUT 3C-REN ENERGY CODE COACH IS HERE TO HELP



The CA Energy Code is updated every 3 years, and January 2023 marks the beginning of a new code cycle. The Energy Code (commonly referred to as Title 24) applies to newly constructed buildings, additions, and alterations. According to the CA Energy Commission, the energy code is "...a vital pillar of California's climate action plan. The 2022 Energy Code will produce benefits to support the state's public health, climate, and clean energy goals." Looking Back!

National Drive Electric Week

This past September, the Sustainability Division hosted two National Drive Electric Week (NDEW) events.

An Electric Vehicle (EV) Ride and Drive took place at the Ventura County Government Center, where attendees could test drive a variety of vehicles including affordable sedans, SUV's, electric motorbikes, and ebikes from different vendors. Attendees were able to speak with real EV owners at the static EV showcase, where 12 different models were on display. Regional partners like the Ventura County Air Pollution Control District (APCD) and Clean Power Alliance (CPA) also supported education and outreach with their own information booths. Another EV Showcase occurred at the Thursday Oxnard Plaza Park Farmers' Market. This EV Showcase was a fantastic opportunity to promote EVs, their affordability, and available EV rebates and incentives. Regional partners like the Ventura County APCD, Santa Barbara Community Environmental Council (CEC-SB), and CPA supported bilingual education and outreach.

Clean Air Day

To celebrate Clean Air Day, the Division collaborated with Ventura STEM Network to bring EV-related youth activities to 17 classrooms throughout the County. Teachers could choose to participate in one of two engaging activities: "rEV Your Engines" or "Drive Your Imagination". The "Drive Your Imagination" activity involved a coloring contest based on the Evie McWheelie cartoon character. Students in the STEM program at Camarillo and Fillmore Middle Schools participated in the "rEV Your Engines", in which students built toy remote control electric cars.



Other EV Activities

On October 6th, the Division's EV Coach, Nancy Clarin, participated in a public webinar called Get Charged: Everything You Need to Know to Drive Electric. The webinar provided an overview of EVs, highlighted upcoming EV-related events, and online resources like our Drive Clean Newsletter and Transportation Electrification webpage. The webinar also included an overview of Access Clean CA, a convenient tool that allows individuals to apply to multiple CA rebates on one platform.
