TRI-COUNTY REGIONAL ENERGY ALLIANCE

The Tri-County Regional Energy Network (3C-REN) is a partnership between Ventura, Santa Barbara, and San Luis Obispo Counties to improve energy efficiency in our region. With \$50M in ratepayer funds allocated over 7 years (via the California Public Utilities Commission), 3C-REN offers free services for households and workforce professionals, returning utility ratepayer dollars to our local community. 3C-REN currently offers 3 programs:



BUILDING PERFORMANCE TRAINING	Building Performance Training: For professionals, 3C-REN offers free training events for everyone from plan examiners and architects to contractors and realtors. Past training topics include Passive House design, air sealing, and sales skills. Find upcoming events at <u>3C-REN.org/events</u> .
HOME ENERGY SAVINGS	Home Energy Savings: Households can receive free and discounted upgrades like smart thermostats and water heaters to reduce energy use at home. Apply at <u>3C-</u> <u>REN.org/home</u> .
ENERGY CODE CONNECT	Energy Code Connect: For anyone with energy code questions, free compliance support is available from the Energy Code Coach at <u>3C-REN.org/code</u> . Additionally, sign-up for energy code training events and regional code forums at <u>3C-REN.org/events</u> .

Since 2019, 3C-REN has hosted over 50 events with nearly 1,000 attendees. In 2020, 3C-REN has engaged over 150 residents in the Home Energy Savings program.

GREENING BUSINESS

Ventura County Green Business (VCGB) Program and the kWh Countdown Pilot Project, both implemented by Ventura County Regional Energy Alliance (VCREA), are working to create a vibrant green economy and helping businesses reach their sustainability goals.

 kWh Countdown provides business owners
with the necessary information and analysis to invest in energy efficient projects with confidence though FREE auditing and benchmarking services. To date, more than \$130,000 has been invested in 17 energy audits of local businesses.

Being certified shows the community and customers that they care about sustainability, committed to taking action to conserve resources, and complies with environmental regulations. To date, 35

The DIY Home Energy Saving Toolkit is designed to increase knowledge of home energy and water usage through a hands-on experience, to help community members assess the performance of their home, and identify where improvements can be made to save money and increase comfort. Each Toolkit contains supplies, measuring devices, and a handbook to enable a user to evaluate and understand their home's energy and water use and utility bills. 
