Sustainability Division Applies for a \$1 million Grant for Regional Climate Action Plan

The County of Ventura CEO Sustainability Division applied as the lead agency for a \$1M planning grant under the Climate Pollution Reduction Grants (CPRG). The CPRG is a dual-phased grant program offered by the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) to assist with developing and implementing plans to reduce greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions and other harmful pollutants.

Sustainability plans to develop a Regional Climate Action Plan for Ventura County, in partnership with cities, non-profit organizations and community-based organizations, and other agencies.

EPA expects to distribute awards in Summer 2023.

DRIVE ELECTRIC EARTHDAY IN THE SECOND SECOND

VCREA participated in three highly attended community Earth Day celebrations in Thousand Oaks, Oxnard, and Fillmore. At each event, they engaged visitors with a combination of interactive booths, static EV displays, and EV painting stations while providing comprehensive EV information, brochures, and virtual EV ride and drives.



THOUSAND OAKS ARBOR EARTH DAY

More than 100 enthusiastic participants visited VCREA's booth at the annual Thousand Oaks Arbor Earth Day celebration. VCREA's participation was threefold, including an engaging and interactive booth, a static EV display, and a kid-friendly EV painting station.

EARTH DAY FARMERS MARKET

VCREA in partnership with the Oxnard Downtowners hosted a "Mini-EV Display," or "Muestra de Carro Electrico," at Oxnard's Plaza Park Earth Day Farmer's Market.
