Step 3: Email <u>sustainability@ventura.org</u> a screenshot of your "in progress" actions to confirm your participation.


Step 4: On August 1st, we will email you to see how things went and hopefully receive confirmation of your 3 completed actions.

The first 5 employees to send us proof of completing their actions on August 1st will receive sustainable swag to aid them on their plastic free journey.




## Ventura County EV's and Infrastructure Goals





Ventura County currently has 40,730 registered Zero Emission Vehicles (ZEVs), exceeding the projected 2025 goal of 35,307 ZEVs and we are getting closer to the State of California's goal to deploy 5 million ZEVs by 2030.



VCREA is receiving ~\$16.8M in state and federal grant funding for EV infrastructure projects. These funds are expected to add 301 Level 2 and 42 DC Fast Charging ports, bringing us closer to our 2025 EV Infrastructure goals.

This program is offered by the Community Environmental Council, the first and only nonprofit on the Central Coast to deliver Climate Stewards certification.



1 Why were you interested in working in sustainability?


**T:** I recognize the importance of raising awareness about ecofriendly practices and wanted to join a team that encourages environmental responsibility.
